IV Report Annuale SERN 2023

Catellani introduce le linee principali della relazione annuale evidenziando 3 elementi:

- Un alto livello di implementazione dei progetti, con 20 progetti sviluppati in Italia e Svezia con partner europei. È importante aggiungere che cinque progetti sono stati premiati dalle agenzie nazionali in Italia e Svezia con il riconoscimento di "best practice": questa è la prova del livello qualitativo dei progetti della Rete. I progetti premiati sono: BE+, DEEDS, Playing, Cope e Digital Trainers.

SERN partecipa anche a iniziative a livello europeo, come l'ICC insieme ai comuni di Cervia, Trollhättan e Vänersborg, per sviluppare nuovi progetti e approcci con i Local Green Deals.

Nonostante un tasso di approvazione più basso rispetto agli anni precedenti, quasi il 40% dei progetti presentati è stato approvato, con una conseguente somma di € 1.260.000,00 di sovvenzioni concesse. In relazione a questi dati, il numero di proposte progettuali è stato di 31 e da queste sono state presentate 21 nuove proposte.

Gli otto progetti approvati riguardano i settori dell'istruzione e dell'ECEC, del turismo sostenibile e della mobilità sostenibile.

Riassumendo, è possibile individuare tre elementi che contraddistinguono gli anni 2023: il riconoscimento dell'eccellenza, la partecipazione più attiva e impegnata dei membri e l'efficace attuazione dei progetti.

V Relazione finanziaria 2023 e relazione del Collegio dei Revisori

Burenby chiede a Catellani di presentare la Relazione finanziaria 2023.

L'esercizio finanziario 2023 è stato chiuso con un utile netto di esercizio di € 7.313,18. Questo segna l'ottavo anno consecutivo di risultati finanziari positivi per la rete. Il totale delle attività, pari a € 951.343,20, mostra una percentuale simile di crediti rispetto al totale delle attività. Per quanto riguarda le passività, il fondo di riserva ha raggiunto € 121.240,59. In generale, le operazioni dell'anno 2023 hanno confermato la tendenza degli anni precedenti e ciò si riflette nei risultati finanziari positivi illustrati di seguito. Nell'esercizio finanziario 2023, le attività istituzionali del SERN hanno comportato un'allocazione strategica delle risorse in diversi ambiti che sono stati funzionali all'efficacia operativa della rete e agli obiettivi fissati nella Strategia 21-27.

Nel 2023, le entrate istituzionali del SERN hanno superato le previsioni di budget, evidenziando una performance finanziaria positiva in diverse aree chiave. Le entrate istituzionali totali del SERN ammontano a € 133.757,71 indicano che l'organizzazione gode di una solida base di contributi da parte dei membri con strategie positive di sensibilizzazione e reclutamento, come dimostra l'eccedenza delle quote dei nuovi membri. Il risultato significativo del sostegno ai progetti dei membri e alle attività di formazione suggerisce che il SERN sta rispondendo efficacemente agli interessi dei membri, sebbene sia presente un notevole margine di miglioramento.

Si è registrata una moderata crescita delle entrate istituzionali, dovuta principalmente all'aumento del finanziamento dei progetti UE e delle quote associative. L'aumento del finanziamento dei progetti riflette il successo delle domande di sovvenzione e dell'esecuzione dei progetti. L'aumento delle entrate statutarie, in particolare delle quote di adesione, indica un crescente interesse e un'espansione della rete. In futuro, le strategie finanziarie del SERN dovranno continuare a concentrarsi sulla diversificazione dei flussi di reddito e sul miglioramento delle proposte di valore per i membri, per sostenere e consolidare questa tendenza positiva.

Entrate statutarie: Le entrate statutarie effettive di € 75.114,23 hanno superato il budget previsto di € 71.500,00, indicando un contributo finanziario più forte del previsto da parte dei flussi di entrate principali della rete. Ciò include le quote dei membri esistenti e di quelli nuovi, che sono fondamentali per il mantenimento delle operazioni della rete e per il finanziamento delle sue varie iniziative.

Quote dei membri del 2023: Le quote raccolte dai soci nel 2023 sono state pari a € 69.889,85, leggermente inferiori ai €70.000,00 preventivati.

1. Quote dei nuovi soci 2023: Le entrate derivanti dalle quote dei nuovi soci hanno superato notevolmente le aspettative, con cifre effettive pari a € 5.224,38 a fronte di un budget modesto di € 1.500,00.

2. Altre entrate: Anche la categoria delle altre entrate ha superato le previsioni, con un totale di €47.745,31 euro rispetto ai €40.000,00 previsti. Quest'area comprende vari flussi di reddito che contribuiscono alla diversità operativa e alla sostenibilità finanziaria del SERN.

Sostegno ai soci in relazione ai progetti: Il sostegno ai membri in relazione ai progetti ha generato €37.768,02, un importo significativamente superiore ai €25.000,00 preventivati. Questo risultato superiore di €12.768,02 evidenzia l'impegno attivo della rete nel sostenere i progetti dei membri.

Attività di formazione: Le entrate derivanti dalle attività di formazione hanno raggiunto € 8.580,00, superando il budget di € 3.580,00.

Le entrate istituzionali del SERN ammontano complessivamente a € 627.542,06

Per quanto riguarda le spese, il personale è la spesa più significativa, per la quale il SERN ha speso €61.760,90 (con un costo totale, inclusi i rimborsi dai progetti finanziati dall'UE, di €222.982,00). Il costo del personale finanziato attraverso le entrate istituzionali è stato superiore a quello preventivato a causa di una maggiore quantità di risorse disponibili.

Burenby ringrazia Catellani e chiede al Presidente del Collegio dei Revisori dei Conti, Marco Giorgi, di presentare la relazione per l'anno 2023.

Giorgi presenta la relazione dei revisori dei conti: Insieme, revisori italiani e svedesi, hanno esaminato attentamente il bilancio, secondo gli standard applicati sia in Svezia che in Italia. La nostra valutazione è positiva.

Tre punti sono stati evidenziati da Giorgi: le nuove adesioni che hanno incrementato lo sviluppo e il miglioramento della rete, l'implementazione di nuove attività realizzate dalla Segreteria e il numero di progetti approvati che possono dare continuità (anche dal punto di vista finanziario) alle attività della Rete.

Il Consiglio può essere esonerato dalla responsabilità finanziaria per l'anno 2023.

Burenby ringrazia i membri del Collegio dei revisori dei conti, sottolineando che l'Assemblea generale voterà la relazione. Sottolinea che una solida situazione finanziaria è un prerequisito per la realizzazione delle attività tra i membri e all'interno della Rete.

VI Proposta di bilancio 2024

Catellani introduce il documento sulla proposta di bilancio 2024.

Il bilancio 2024 è in linea con quello degli anni precedenti. Le entrate totali previste per l'anno ammontano a € 296.710, una cifra che rispecchia le spese preventivate. Al centro delle nostre operazioni finanziarie c'è l'attività istituzionale del SERN, che assorbe una parte significativa del nostro bilancio. Con uno stanziamento di € 140.610, questo segmento riguarda le funzioni principali che mantengono in funzione la rete. Questo finanziamento è fondamentale per garantire che il nostro quadro istituzionale funzioni senza intoppi e con una governance efficace.

Nel piano finanziario della rete per il 2024, il totale delle spese istituzionali è calcolato in € 140.610. Questo stanziamento garantisce il funzionamento e lo sviluppo strategico del SERN. I costi stimati per il personale dovrebbero essere compresi tra € 235.000 e € 241.000.

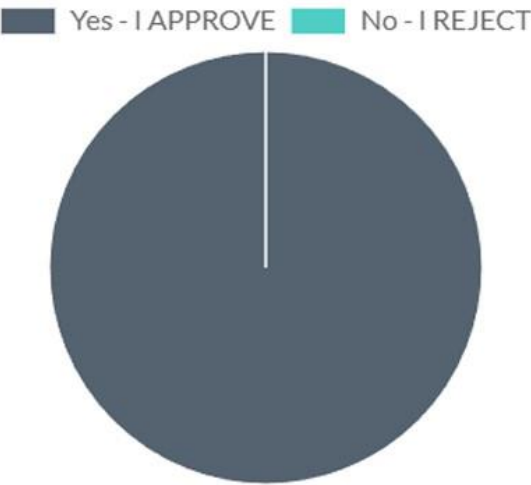

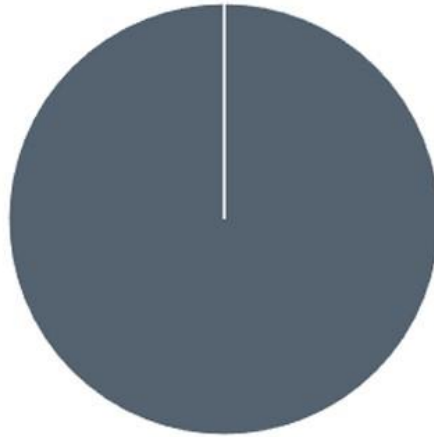

Budget 2024

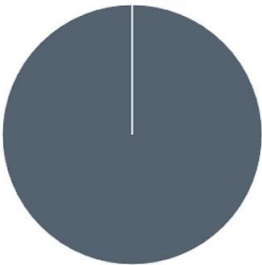

Introduction

The SERN Annual Report for 2023 provides a broad overview of the activities and achievements of our network. This year has been marked by substantial advancements in the implementation of EU-funded projects, with a total of 20 projects undertaken by the members across Italy and Sweden, together with their European partners.

For the first time since the introduction of the Erasmus Programme five of these projects have been recognized as best practices within the Erasmus Programme by the Italian National Agency (DEEDS Project and Digital Trainers) and the Swedish E+ National Agency (PLAYING project, COPE project and BE+ project), a clear indication of the quality and impact of our work and cooperation efforts. Also the participation of SERN (and three of members) in the second edition of the ICC initiative by the EU Commission further represents our commitment to high quality cooperation in the framework of EU led initiatives.

Our ambitions for the year 2023 of fostering cooperation among the members was sharply reflected in the project ideas generated, with 31 proposals (mostly in the area of inclusive communities) directly aligning with the thematic priorities set forth by our strategy (77% in the area of inclusive communities).

The transformation of 31 project ideas in 21 new project proposals submitted is indicative of a dynamic and innovative network, poised to address the challenges of the future. Although lower than previous years, the approval rate of almost 40% of the projects generated a total EU grant award sum of € 1.260.000.

Member engagement within our network is crucial. In 2023, engagement was evidenced by a 63% participation rate of the members in new or ongoing projects and activities.

In summary, the year 2023 has been a period characterized by effective project implementation, recognition of excellence, and a strong commitment to our collective goals. As we document these achievements, we also set our sights on the future, prepared to continue our collaborative efforts towards achieving a more inclusive and sustainable Europe.

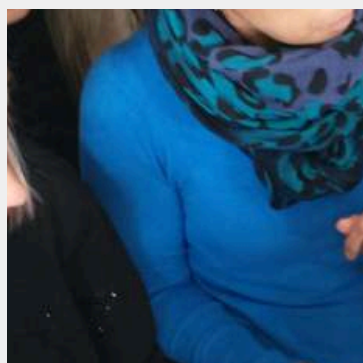
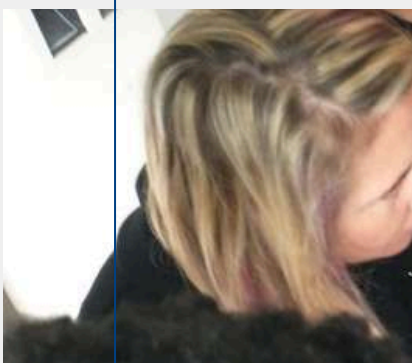
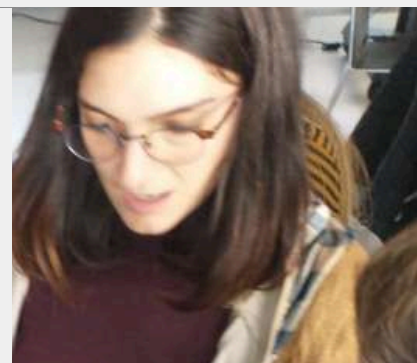
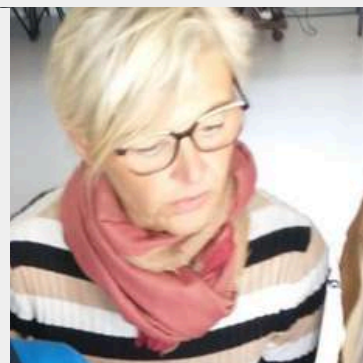
As a non-profit transnational association, SERN has three characteristics that makes it unique:

- It is open to civil society and to private actors.

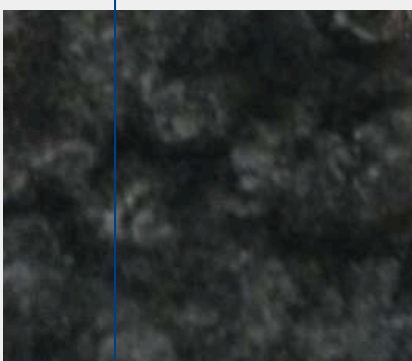

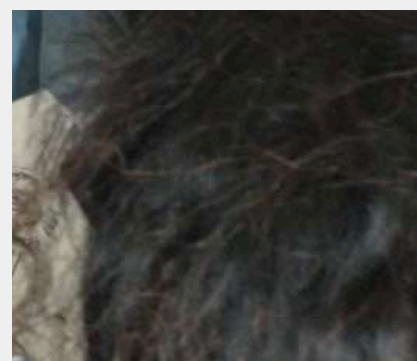

STATUTORY ACTIVITIES

GENERAL ASSEMBLY

The SERN General Assembly 2023 took place on the 11 and 12 May 2023 hosted by the Municipality of Cervia, Italy.

The event was officially opened on Thursday morning with welcome speeches by **Bianca Maria Manzi** - Member of the SERN Executive Board and Councilor for European Policies at the Comune di Cervia, host of the GA, **Gert-Inge Andersson** - Chairperson of the SERN Executive Board, and **Nicola Catellani**, Coordinator of the Network.

The General Assembly was a two-day event during which more than 120 Italian and Swedish members had the opportunity to meet in Cervia to discuss and debate priority issues for the Network's communities.

Along with the usual session of the General Assembly, a series of seminars, workshops and moments of reflection took place.

The event was structured along three thematic strands related to the three priority areas of the Network: Strengthening **Inclusive Communities**, through seminars and workshops focusing on the promotion of quality education and opportunities for internationalisation and mobility; **Digitalised Communities** with a focus on digitalization and marginalisation of vulnerable groups, and **Green and Sustainable Communities**, deepening the Local Green Deals approach on the fields of city planning and climate adaptation, local food systems and sustainable tourism.

The session devoted to the General Assembly which saw the participation of Swedish Ambassador Jan Björklund *"There is always something to learn from each other. All countries in Europe are small but together we are strong. This collaboration you have between Sweden and Italy is a great example"*.

During the session, the Italian and Swedish delegates were called upon to elect the new members of the SERN Executive Board and Board of Auditors for the period 2023-2025.

Furthermore, the **Province of Parma** and the **Municipality of Vänersborg** were recognized for their consistent engagement and contributions as SERN members throughout 2023 receiving the award for the most active members.

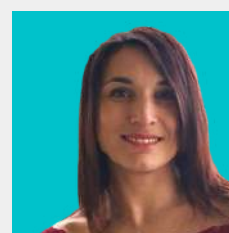

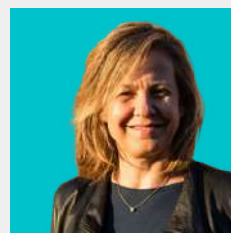

Executive Board

The three Executive Board meetings were held on 24 March, 11 May and 17 November 2023.

The first meeting was held online the 24th of March, where the members were updated on the new projects that started in 2023, and approved the 2022 draft annual report and the 2023 General Assembly programme. The Board welcomed two new members to the Network: the Italian Municipalities of San Lazzaro and Bologna (Education Department).

The second meeting was held in Cervia the 11th of May, during the General Assembly, where the report of the Board of Auditors 2023 was presented.

The third and final session for 2023 was held on the 17th of November in Motala. During the meeting, key topics were addressed, including deliberations on financial issues, strategic discussions on the network's upcoming thematic events, and planning for the next General Assembly 24. Moreover, three members joined the Network: EmiliAmbiente, Azienda Servizi Sociali Bolzano and Liceo Marconi from Parma. For the first time, the Executive Board welcomed a partner: High School El Batan from Spain.



OVERVIEW ON THE ACTIVITIES

Intelligent Cities Challenge - ICC

Swedish and Italian municipalities have joined forces through SERN to participate in the ICC, a European Commission initiative driving the green and digital transition of local economies through Local Green Deals as a consortium for the second time. The consortium, led by SEN, involves the Municipalities of Cervia, Vänersborg and Trollhättan and focuses on energy and renewables.

The consortium completed in December the first ICC phase, identifying two shared strategic objectives on which to focus their transnational collaboration: to increase the sustainable energy production and to improve the energy efficiency.

The ambitions statements come after months of critical reflection and strategic planning which culminated at the ICC Strategy City Lab in November 2023 where we had the opportunity to gather for the first time in-person with 200+ members of the ICC community to discuss, evaluate and give feedback before finalising our strategies.

Prequel

PREQUEL - *Designing a More Equitable Europe: Capacity Building and Tools for Local Authorities* was a project of the Province of Parma co-financed by the Emilia-Romagna Region in which SERN curated and designed the seminars, the webinar and the final publication. The objectives of Prequel were to offer civil servants dealing with equal opportunities activities and policymakers a knowledge framework of European policies and to learn and exchange good practices with other European countries, with specific reference to the Swedish cases.

The project comprised four training events, including discussions on European funding opportunities related to gender equality and equal opportunities, a webinar featuring speakers such as Åsa Hedberg (Östergötland County) and Lena Heikka (Luleå Municipality) sharing their practices on collecting and analyzing gender-disaggregated data, gender mainstreaming throughout project cycles, and building a network of CUGs (Comitati Unici di Garanzia) and developing project ideas. An output of the seminar was a handbook that highlights three main elements: European funding opportunities for gender equality, integrating gender mainstreaming into project cycles, and gender-sensitive communication.



Local Green Deals workshop

In January 2023, an online workshop titled "Think Globally, Act Locally Through the Local Green Deals" was conducted by SERN. The workshop aimed to explore how municipalities and other stakeholders can effectively implement the objectives outlined in the Green Deal at the local level.

The workshop focused on the essential aspects of the European Union Green Deal and its significance in the context of local governance and sustainability initiatives. Participants engaged in discussions on various policy areas and strategies aimed at promoting environmental sustainability, resource efficiency, and climate resilience within local communities. One of the key highlights of the workshop was the emphasis on the role of local governments, community organizations, and citizens in driving sustainable development efforts. Participants exchanged insights and experiences regarding best practices, challenges, and opportunities associated with implementing green initiatives at the local level. Furthermore, the workshop underscored the importance of collaboration and partnership among stakeholders in achieving the objectives of the Green Deal. It provided a platform for networking and knowledge-sharing among participants, fostering a sense of collective responsibility towards environmental stewardship and sustainable development.

European Week of Regions and Cities

The Secretariat in October participated in the #EURegionsWeek held in Brussels. This event, known as the European Week of Regions and Cities, serves as an annual gathering where municipalities and regions from across Europe showcase their capacity to create growth and jobs and prove the importance of the local and regional level for good European governance.

For our network, this event represented a crucial opportunity to engage in dialogue surrounding the shared challenges faced by Europe's diverse regions and cities. It served as a forum to explore potential solutions, foster collaboration, and forge connections with fellow municipalities. Beyond mere discourse, our participation allowed us to leverage the platform for capacity-building, facilitating a robust exchange of knowledge, experiences, and best practices.

Throughout the event, we were actively engaged in discussions, workshops, and networking sessions, delving into topics ranging from sustainable development to innovation in urban planning.



Study Visit

On 14-15 and 16 November, a group of representatives of the Province of Parma, experts in the field of management and maintenance of school buildings travelled to Sweden to carry out a study visit to the four municipalities of the SERN network, Linköping, Motala, Mjölby and Norrköping. The delegation, led by SERN, was interested in understanding how Municipalities in Sweden works in school building planning to acquire new practices and working methodologies to transfer in their own context. In Linköping the group met on the first day Lejonfastigheter and visited Vreta school, the second day, the group was welcomed in the Platengymnasiet, then moved to the city hall of Mjölby. The last day was spent in Norrköping.

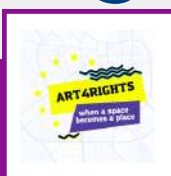

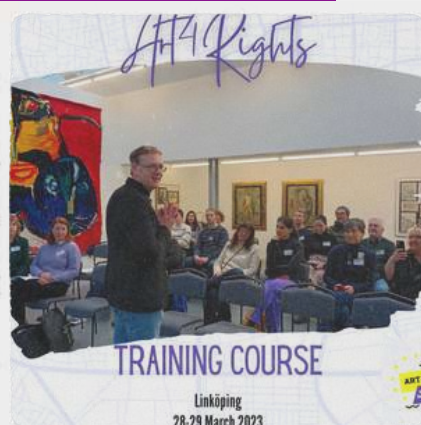

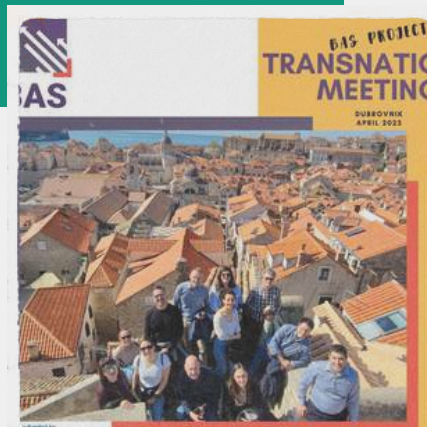

2. Testing the Training Package Methodology, the project result 2: The methodology underwent testing for refinement and effectiveness.

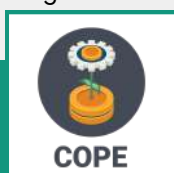

- **"Train the Trainer" Manual:** Designed to empower those who lead the capacity building process within schools to effectively guide colleagues in international matters, this manual enhances their ability to plan and execute EU projects, particularly within the Erasmus programme.
- **Capacity Building Toolbox:** Recognising the challenges of navigating the Erasmus+ programme, this toolbox serves as a roadmap for schools, providing resources to aid in the successful development of international activities. It equips schools with the necessary administrative and organizational resources to bolster their international capabilities.

The project developed:

- **Learning model on cooperative entrepreneurship:** a curriculum, based on 4 different modules that together form a comprehensive course on management for a cooperative venture to enhance the ability of entrepreneurship advisors to train adults on cooperative entrepreneurship.
- **The GAP analysis report:** includes the results of the investigation conducted by partners, aimed at collecting information on the training needs of those who already offer training on the cooperative model. The GAP analysis report resumes the data collected through interviews, online questionnaires and focus groups in the 4 countries.
- **Pilot training.** It consisted in testing the learning model's applicability and usability and validate with experienced trainers the content and training approaches. The data gathered are available in the IO3 pilot survey report.
- **Gamified e-learning platform:** a comprehensive knowledge repository, granting immediate open access to an extensive collection of digital learning resources. This platform is considered a cornerstone of knowledge for advisors and trainers, offering significant potential for integration into their professional practices.

The project aimed to promote transnational mobility opportunities for upper secondary school students in which the school plays a more active role in driving the process while offering high-quality learning experiences and ensuring recognition of the period(s) spent abroad.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

- to develop and test a joint transnational curriculum/programme among the involved schools;
- to identify a set of common assessment and certification methods tailored to the acquired competencies and skills;
- to build organizational capacity in upper secondary schools through the identification and solution of administrative and management problems pertaining to the long-term transnational mobility of pupils.

Two coordination meetings were held in Linköping and Parma in 2023. Sixteen students from Italy, Spain and Sweden participated in a mobility exchange, spending up to eight weeks in the three partner schools to test the results produced.

The project, which ended in August 2023, produced four results:

- Transnational Study Plan: A common curriculum including eight subjects.
- Common Assessment Tools: A standardised set of assessment tools to ensure fair evaluation and recognition of students' achievements during their time abroad.
- Administrative and Organizational Package: An efficient framework to manage the logistics of student mobility, ensuring a smooth and well-organized process.
- Online Platform for Teachers: A dedicated digital hub to train teachers, with a specific focus on the lessons learnt from the mobility experience of the students who tested the outputs.

The project IMPROVE foresaw 4 rounds of activities as structured training courses organised by the Expertise Dementia Center in Belgium and FoU centre of the Linköping Municipality for a total of 42 mobilities managed by SERN as leader of the Erasmus consortium.

Participants, mainly social assistants, nurses and assistant nurses, specialised caregivers had the opportunity to increase their professional knowledge on how to behave with people with dementia and how to improve their relations with patients' families to increase the cooperation and synergies.

The main areas of improvement were: improving the intercultural skills of the staff, developing skills in the valorisation of the staff working within elderly care services, increasing the European dimension of training.

In particular in the training held in Belgium, was focus on tools and methods to improve the communication with people with dementia and to develop a trustful relation with families based on four main concepts: collaborate, support, facilitate and tune in. In Sweden, the approach was on the use of new technologies and innovative digital tools and platforms to increase the participants knowledge and to open their mind in an innovative reality.

- to increase preschool teachers' professional skills on the narrative approach/curriculum.

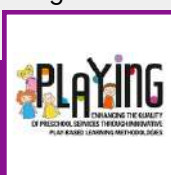

GENERAL OBJECTIVE

The general objective of the project was to increase quality in early childhood education and care through the development of new knowledge on teaching approaches based on the role of play.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

- to strengthen the skills of preschool teachers through innovative play-based learning methodology
- to improve the quality of preschool services by introducing transnational peer review-based processes in relation to learning methods



The Playing project concluded in August 2023 with the development of the three planned intellectual outputs:

- Mapping of a play based learning as a teaching method: built on a mapping aimed at giving an overview of the topic of the project, in order to determine the existing needs and the gaps in methodologies and knowledge related to play-based learning in preschools.
- Training methodology: a methodology on play-based learning as a teaching method. The training methodology draws on the collected experiences from the playing project and outlines the principles and methods used by ECE practitioners to enable children.
- Peer review toolkit: a set of materials and documents, tested in the 4 peer reviews conducted that can be useful to anyone who wants to perform a peer review, explaining how to evaluate preschool services and providing guidelines, ready-to-use materials and templates.

GENERAL OBJECTIVE

The project TRANSIT aimed at raising awareness, while stimulating behavioural change, about sustainable mobility through the development of informal training paths for workers, families, and young adults.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

- to develop innovative learning methods through which local civil servants and decision-makers could bring about change in the attitude of citizens, in particular workers, families and young adults in relation to the theme of sustainable mobility.
- To create informal learning opportunities among workers, families, and young adults, aimed at increasing knowledge on environmental challenges.
- To promote behavioural change among adult learners, namely workers, families and young adults by raising awareness and engaging them in positive actions pertaining to sustainable mobility.

The TRANSIT project successfully concluded in August 2022 and produced training tools that can support public administrations in creating awareness-raising initiatives with respect to the topic of sustainable mobility particularly cycling. The motivation behind the project was to develop strategies to raise awareness and engage citizens on the topic of sustainable mobility to contribute to the fight to climate action, reduce emissions, by also enhancing the infrastructural investments made by PAs in sustainable mobility infrastructures. In fact, project partners recognized the importance of changing the mobility habits of citizens, by focusing on behavioral change. To do this, they have developed a series of tools that can support administrations, NGOs that want to work on this issue in raising awareness and involving citizens so that they change their mobility habits. In this regard, the tools developed are three:



A context analysis where good practices implemented at a local level by the project partners are collected. The practices will be a source of inspiration for other organizations who are facing the same challenges in other EU countries. The first product also envisages a survey template for civil servants willing to conduct a survey on citizens' mobility habits. The second product will be an online training course on how to promote citizen's behavioral change and where takeaways from the challenges faced by project partners so far are widely explained. Finally, a digital toolbox offering resources, working materials, and instructions on how to build a sustainable mobility awareness raising campaign. These tools are made available to PAs and NGOs willing to take meaningful actions in this direction.
